Hourly Internship Attendance Report / SLL Time Log

The intern should complete his/her time log in the Watermark Student Learning & Licensure (SLL) <u>each day</u> (<u>www.vialivetext.com</u>). The time log is used to document the intern's attendance and activities during the placement. The time log is also used to verify that intern's have met the attendance and full days of teaching requirements during the internship semester. Below are the basic categories used in the time log:

- Observing and Assisting
- Teaching (not full day)
- FULL DAY TEACHING AND LEADING
- After school related (activities, events, meetings)
- School Holiday (document but indicate zero hours)
- Absent (document absent but indicate zero hours)
- Other (Professional Development, EDU 400/500, UA Internship Activities, school closures for inclement weather, etc.)
